

Minutes of the Selectmen's Meeting
March 8, 2022
Election Day

Members present: Scott Young, Chairman, Brian Monahan, and Lynn Sweet

The business portion of the Selectmen's Meeting was called to order at 10:00AM. The Selectmen reviewed and approved payroll and payment of bills. Minutes from the February 22, 2022 meeting were read and approved. Abatement recommendations from the assessor were read. Having agreed with Assessor's findings, the Selectmen signed and approved- noting the Assessor has not gone over all of the abatement forms that have been received. A letter of response to a resident in reference to 14 Lake View Drive was read and signed. The Selectmen also approved and signed a Timber Tax Warrant, and reviewed miscellaneous correspondence. The Selectmen believe it would be beneficial to the Town for the Memorial Day Parade to return and will ask for feedback from residents at the Town Meeting. The Board discussed the Beach Program for the summer. There have been no applications received for the lifeguard positions as of yet. The Town has been in contact with NH Department of Water Resources and will have further conversations with the State concerning the beach area.

The Board also discussed a letter from Bow Lake Camp Owner's Association asking to use the beach area for two different Saturdays during the summer with the parking lot being closed off the evening before. It was decided to confer with the Police Chief and the Fire Chief and will have to make a decision at the next meeting. Dates for interviewing potential candidates for the position of Building Inspector will be discussed once the new Board member is known.

The Board had preliminary talks concerning the Town Meeting.

At 10:54AM, a motion was made, seconded, and voted on to convene until 4:00PM.

The Selectmen's Meeting was called back into order at 4:02PM.

Preparations for the Town Meeting continued with several items being clarified with the Town's Master Plan being one of them. The last time the Master Plan was done was 20 years ago and is overdue. It was noted that Barn Door Gap Bridge rehabilitation project is moving forward. The Board authorized signature on revised bid proposal from North East Earth Mechanics.

The Fire Chief was in the building and was asked about the possibility of the Bow Lake Camp Owner's using the beach area. He has no problem in accommodating the request. The Select board felt it imperative to make sure the necessary notifications are made on Facebook and the Town's website along with coordinating with the Grange.

Scott Young thanked his fellow Board Members for their time together and wished them well. Scott's term will expire on Saturday March 12th-he'll be missed.

With no further business to be discussed, a motion was made, seconded and voted on to adjourn at 4:45PM.
