Asset Inventory and Vulnerability

The following community assets include all public and private facilities that the Hazard Mitigation Committee considers essential for the delivery of vital services for the protection of the community, such as emergency operations centers, shelters, or utilities. All critical facilities and key resources are included in a series of maps in the Appendix. Assets are organized into five categories:

- <u>Emergency Response Facilities</u> are primary facilities and resources that may be needed during an emergency response
- <u>Non-Emergency Response Facilities</u> are facilities considered essential, that although critical, not necessary for immediate emergency response effort.
- <u>Facilities and Populations to Protect</u> can be defined broadly to include those who are not able to access and use the standard resources offered in disaster preparedness and planning, response, and recovery
- <u>Potential Resources</u> are local assets that may be used during emergencies.
- Water Resources are water sources that may be used during emergencies.

We need to add street numbers or other way of locating the highlighted areas on a map. We can only map things that have something that identifies their specific location. (bridges, dams, and emergency routes are excluded because we have their locations in our database.)
